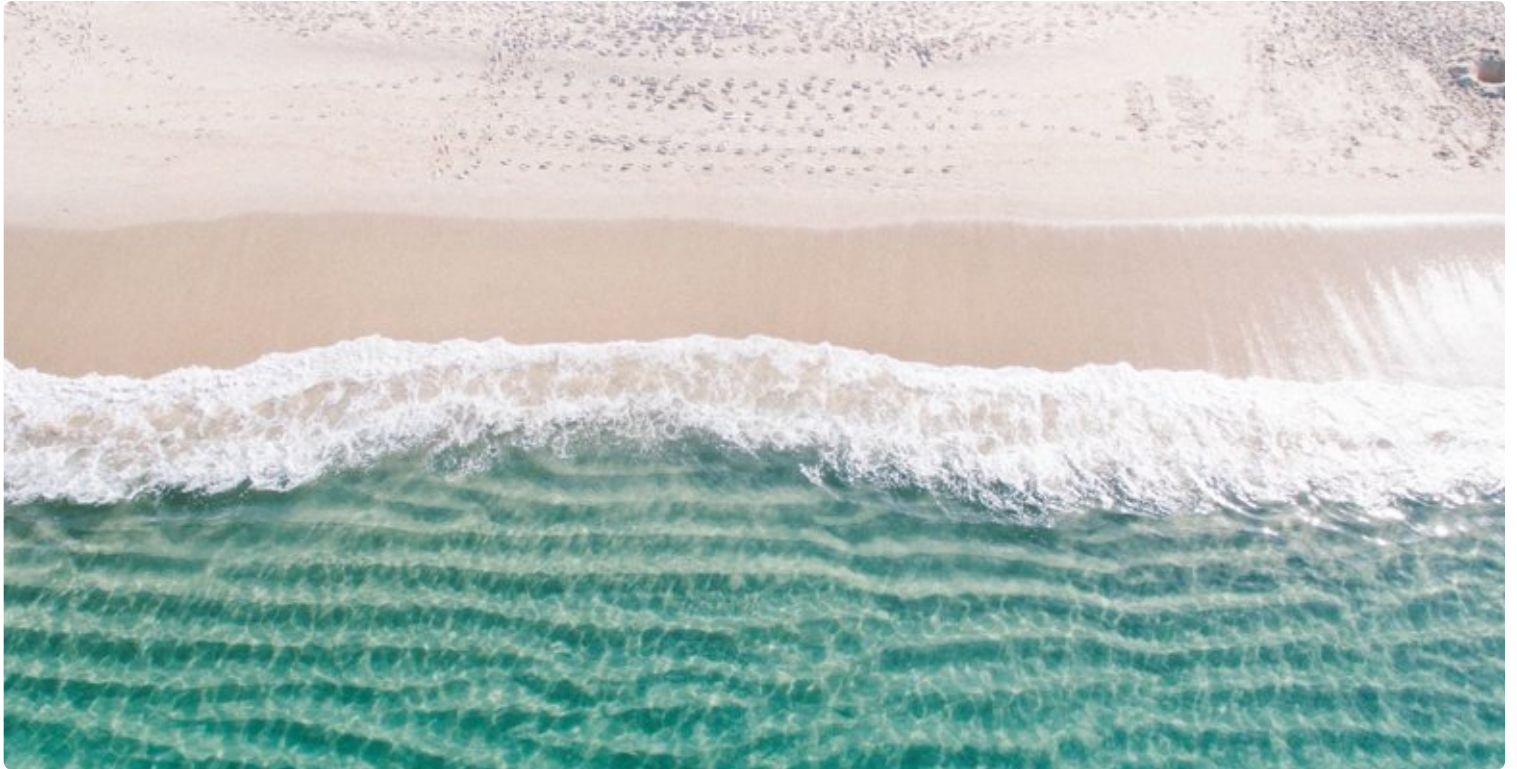

Suggested | Nice Food Tour | Nice

Suggested | Discover Nice

It's impossible to talk about Nice without mentioning the famous Promenade des Anglais (English Promenade). Formerly a favourite resort for English people during winter months, it's today the most famous tourist attraction of the city.

This world-famous 7km promenade runs from the Castle Hill (La colline du Château in French) to Nice airport.

If you are coming to Nice for the first time, I strongly recommend you to at least walk on the part that goes from the old town of Nice to the Negresco hotel, passing through the Jardin Albert 1er and the Palais de la Méditerranée.

If you want to do the whole Promenade des Anglais, it's best to rent a bike or rollerblades!

Another must see in Nice is its old town with its shady alleyways, colourful facades and typically Mediterranean shutters.

Impossible to talk about Nice Old Town (le Vieux Nice) without mentioning the Cours Saleya, where is held almost every morning (except on Monday) the famous market and flower market.

On Monday morning, the Cours Saleya becomes a big open-air flea market! It's also the ideal place to have a drink or eat something at one of the many terraces.

When you visit the Old Town of Nice, I also recommend you to see:

The Courthouse Square (Place du Palais de Justice)

The Rossetti Square (Place Rossetti), where the magnificent Saint Reparata Cathedral is located. There is also the city's best ice cream shop, I will tell you more about it below

The Saint Francis Square (Place Saint François) and its small fish market.

The Castle Hill park (le parc de la Colline du Château) is located on the hill overlooking Nice Old Town. It owes its name to the military fortress that overlooked the bay of Nice from the 11th to the 18th century.

You should go to this park for the stunning viewpoints it offers over the city, the Bay of Angels (Baie des Anges), the harbour and the mountains.

Here are the 5 best viewpoints of Nice Castle Hill:

- At the top, with a view of the airport and mountains
- Close to the children's playground area, view of the harbour and the hill of Mont Boron,
- Bellanda Tower: View over the Bay of Angels
- Belvedere near the exit of the elevator
- Cascade du Château, an artificial waterfall, but still very pretty!

You can walk up and down the castle on foot or use the elevator. I recommend you to take the stairs for at least one of the way as this allows you to pass by the Bellanda Tower lookout I mentioned earlier.

If you go down on the other side of the castle, you should take a walk through the castle cemetery, which also offers a beautiful view of the city. It's even better if you can do it at the end of the day to enjoy the sunset!

You understood it, the Castle Hill is really one of the best places to visit in Nice (and my favourite in the town center for its amazing view!).

Visiting Nice also means discovering the local food specialities, the "cuisine Niçoise", during your stay, which is the pride of the niçois (inhabitants of Nice)

- Socca: It's one of the most famous culinary specialities of Nice and one of the most representative of the city. Made from chickpea flour, you will find very good ones in the old town of Nice. Ideally, a good socca should'nt be dry, but slightly creamy inside.



Suggest I Visit and wine tasting at the Chateau de Bellet I Nice

A place steeped in history

At an altitude of 300m on the hills of Nice, the Château de Bellet is located at the highest point of the Bellet AOP.

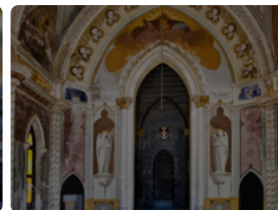
It was in the 18th century that the Barons of Bellet began to plant their vines. This family, originally from Savoie, gave its name to the appellation which celebrated its 70th anniversary in 2011.

On the highest plots of the appellation, the vines of Château de Bellet surround the old family chapel. The monument built in homage to Agnès Roissard de Bellet in 1873 is one of the major imprints left by this family.

Today, the deconsecrated Chapel opens its doors to you all year round to discover our boutique and tasting room where you can taste gourmet wines of character.

The vineyards of Château de Bellet, perched above the hills of Nice, dominate the Mediterranean blue. In the background, the last foothills of the Alps and the Var valley can be seen.

The Château de Bellet welcomes you all year round to discover its terroir through guided tours, walks in the vineyards and tastings.



Suggested | Dinner at the Restaurant Le Plongeur | Nice

An iconic restaurant with a breathtaking view...

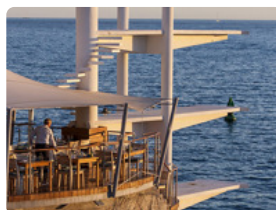
At the end of the nineteenth century a stylish fishing boat was secured on the rock. During “La Belle Époque”, guests could eat and drink tea perched six metres above the waves. This restaurant, connected by a walkway to a charming gazebo typical of that era on the French Riviera, soon became emblematic of the city of Nice.

Following damage to the fishing vessel, architect René Livieri was commissioned in 1941 to bring a new lease of life to the site, giving rise to the Diving Boards on the seaward side with a beach restaurant replacing the gazebo.

Occupying an iconic location in Nice, hovering above the sea on the famous pillar of rock and the base of the diving boards themselves, the restaurant welcomes you in this most unusual setting, steeped in history.

They offer a friendly and convivial cuisine with a modern Mediterranean influence, prepared with fresh, seasonal market produce.

Suggested | Lunch at the Club 55 | Saint Tropez

Discover the iconic Club 55...

Simplicity and authenticity. This place quite apart on the beach of Pampelonne, since its creation in 1955. Its philosophy which is summed up in one sentence: "Here the customer is not the king ... because he is a friend."

This is the most famous club of Saint Tropez and was made famous by Brigitte Bardot who was shortly followed by other celebrities.

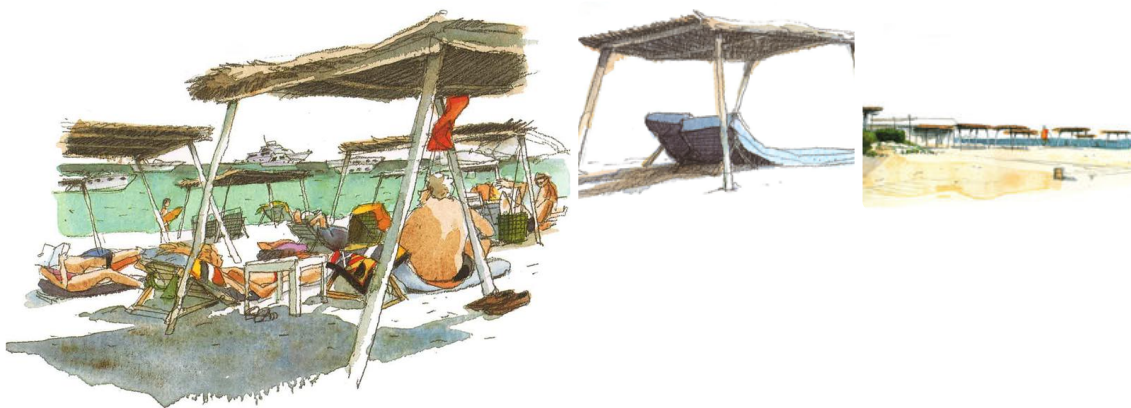
The cooks get busy. Glittering fish, vegetables baskets and succulent fruit sparkle with freshness.

They grow most of the organic vegetables that they cook in their gardens at the Vallon des Bouis farm, but also at Chateau de la Mole and at the Domaine de Piégros.

On the beach, surrounded by reeds, sand lilies and tamarisks, beach boys are raking the sand, sweeping the duckboards and setting up blue canvas sunbeds under the straw huts.

Suggested | Visit Saint Tropez | Saint Tropez

What was once a sleepy fishing village, St. Tropez drew in painters like Paul Signac and Henri Matisse, then later gave way to Hollywood types when Brigitte Bardot's *And God Created Woman* catapulted the town to international fame. On any given day in St. Tropez, you can see the intersection of both: old, but well-maintained candy-colored buildings that meet the blue Mediterranean waters lined with giant yachts. St. Tropez is super clean and there's enough to do while still feeling like you're on a relaxing vacation.

The harbor: The iconic harbor of Saint Tropez is home to many super yachts and one of the best places to go people watching. During the high season, the port is bustling with yachts of all sizes, adding to its glamour. Surrounding the harbor is a very lively promenade lined with chic cafés, restaurants and boutiques.

La Place des Lices: This square is home to one of the town's most popular and vibrant markets. This market is open every Tuesday and Saturday morning and is the perfect experience of a local life. You will find everything from clothes, to beach wear, fresh produce from the farmers market and local crafts.

La Citadelle: This 17th century fortification offers panoramic views from above of the town. Inside there is the Maritime museum which highlights Saint Tropez's nautical history and connection to the sea. The walk up also provides a scenic walk through the charming streets.

Stop by the Café Dior for a drink and don't forget to try the famous Tarte Tropezienne!

Suggested | Sightseeing | Eze Village

This beautiful village dates back to the middle ages and clings impressively to the mountainside above the Mediterranean Sea, between St Jean Cap Ferrat and Monaco. Panoramic views, ancient façades, and an unbelievable attention to detail are some of the most memorable features of this lovely village. Eze's cobblestone streets transport you to a bygone era, where medieval architecture whispers tales of centuries past. Wander through narrow alleys adorned with vibrant flowers, and you'll find yourself enchanted by the preserved authenticity that defines this beautiful village.

Art, clothing, homewares, and ateliers are dotted along the winding streets amongst closed doors - which lead to other, private lives. Colourful displays, delightful windows, and desirable things call you into the unique shops, some of which are hidden in tiny basements within the extraordinary buildings. There is so much history here...For art enthusiasts, the [Galerie de l'Annonciade](#) showcases a diverse collection of contemporary and traditional artwork. Immerse yourself in the creativity inspired by the beauty of Eze.

Literally the pinnacle of the Eze experience is [Le Jardin Exotique](#). Nestled on the cliffs of Eze, the Jardin Exotique stands as a testament to the region's natural beauty. As you wander through the terraced landscapes, each step reveals a burst of vibrant colors and unique flora. The scent of exotic blooms fills the air, creating an enchanting atmosphere that captivates the senses.

You will be able to explore the ruins of Chateau d'Eze, remnants of this ancient castle where you will have a panoramic view of the sea.

There is also the 18th century Eglise Notre Dame d'Assomption which features stunning baroque architecture.

At the entrance of the village, you will also have the Fragonard Factory where you can do a tour to learn the fabrication process of perfume and in the summer the offer mini workshops about creating your own scent.

For the most active, you will enjoy the Nietzsche path which goes from Eze village all the way to Eze beach with stunning views all along the way.

Ready for a short break? You can stop by the "Nid d'Aigle" for a cup of coffee with a panoramic view or enjoy a pastery at the "Taverne d'antan" which is set within the village's medieval streets.

Suggested | Visit Monaco

Monaco is an exceptional site, thanks to its location between sea and mountain, its gardens, its sports and cultural festivities ...

All the assets that make Monaco the ideal destination for a romantic getaway or an unforgettable congress.

The Exotic gardens: Located in Fontvieille just outside of the city center is the Jardin Exotique. This garden sits high on a towering bluff that looks out over the ocean and you will find lush surroundings coupled with stunning vistas.

The Oceanographic museum: The Musée Oceanographique is 90 meters above sea level and it took 11 years to construct the foundations that stop the museum toppling to the ground. It was officially opened in 1910 which makes it one of the oldest aquariums in the world and is dedicated to marine artefacts and oceanography.

The prince's palace: Monaco is known for being a principality and you can see this first hand at the Palais du Prince. The palace sits high above Monaco and dates from the 13th century when it would have been a Genoese fortress. You can visit the palace when the Prince is not in residence, and an easy way to tell is to look for the flag in the main tower.

The museum of the prince's cars: Located in Fontvieille is the Collection of Voitures Anciennes which is an exhibition featuring some of the private cars in the collection of the Prince of Monaco. There are around 100 cars and models and many of these are vintage vehicles from Europe or America.

The harbor: Located at the base of Monaco's famous blustery cliffs is the main harbor of Monaco. Yachts bob on the water and the harbor, which is also known as Port de la Condamine, dates from 1901. The Prince's main yacht is located here as well as those of many moneyed Monaco residents, so this is a top spot to check out these amazing vessels, even if you don't get to go aboard.

The Casino: The Casino de Monte Carlo is one of the most famous casinos in the world, particularly as it was built in the flamboyant Beaux Arts style in 1893. The marble atrium is similarly lavish in style and you will find 28 onyx columns that welcome you to the Gaming Rooms. Fans of James Bond are certain to enjoy the scenery, as this is said to have been the setting for the James Bond novel Casino Royale.

Shopping: Monaco is known for its opulence which also means that you can expect to find a good range of upscale shopping opportunities here. These include perfume, jewellery, and other designer and luxury goods, and one of the best places to splash some cash in Monaco is along the Avenue de Monte-Carlo. If you are looking for famous fashions then you will find these on the swish Boulevard des Moulins. Avenue Princess Grace, named in honor of Grace Kelly, is also another good choice if you want to find some elegant clothes and accessories



Suggested | Dinner at the Restaurant Le Grille at The Hotel de Paris | Monaco
