

Day 1

Suggested I Sightseeing I Eze Village

This beautiful village dates back to the middle ages and clings impressively to the mountainside above the Mediterranean Sea, between St Jean Cap Ferrat and Monaco. Panoramic views, ancient façades, and an unbelievable attention to detail are some of the most memorable features of this lovely village. Eze's cobblestone streets transport you to a bygone era, where medieval architecture whispers tales of centuries past. Wander through narrow alleys adorned with vibrant flowers, and you'll find yourself enchanted by the preserved authenticity that defines this beautiful village.

Art, clothing, homewares, and ateliers are dotted along the winding streets amongst closed doors - which lead to other, private lives. Colourful displays, delightful windows, and desirable things call you into the unique shops, some of which are hidden in tiny basements within the extraordinary buildings. There is so much history here...For art enthusiasts, the <u>Galerie</u> <u>de l'Annonciade</u> showcases a diverse collection of contemporary and traditional artwork. Immerse yourself in the creativity inspired by the beauty of Eze.

Literally the pinnacle of the Eze experience is <u>Le Jardin Exotique</u>. Nestled on the cliffs of Eze, the Jardin Exotique stands as a testament to the region's natural beauty. As you wander through the terraced landscapes, each step reveals a burst of vibrant colors and unique flora. The scent of exotic blooms fills the air, creating an enchanting atmosphere that captivates the senses.

You will be able to explore the ruins of Chateau d'Eze, remnants of this ancient castle where you will have a panoramic view of the sea.

There is also the 18th century Eglise Notre Dame d'Assomption which features stunning baroque architecture.

At the entrance of the village, you will also have the Fragonard Factory where you can do a tour to learn the fabrication process of perfume and in the summer the offer mini workshops about creating your own scent.

For the most active, you will enjoy the Nietzsche path which goes from Eze village all the way to Eze beach with stunning views all along the way.

Ready for a short break? You can stop by the "Nid d'Aigle" for a cup of coffee with a panoramic view or enjoy a pastery at the "Taverne d'antan" which is set within the village's medieval streets.

Suggested I Visit Monaco

Monaco is an exceptional site, thanks to its location between sea and mountain, its gardens, its sports and cultural festivities ...

All the assets that make Monaco the ideal destination for a romantic getaway or an unforgettable congress.

The Exotic gardens:Located in Fontvieille just outside of the city center is the Jardin Exotique. This garden sits high on a towering bluff that looks out over the ocean and you will find lush surroundings coupled with stunning vistas.

The Oceanographic museum: The Musée Oceanographique is 90 meters above sea level and it took 11 years to construct the foundations that stop the museum toppling to the ground. It was officially opened in 1910 which makes it one of the oldest aquariums in the world and is dedicated to marine artefacts and oceanography.

The prince's palace: Monaco is known for being a principality and you can see this first hand at the Palais du Prince. The palace sits high above Monaco and dates from the 13th century when it would have been a Genoese fortress. You can visit the palace when the Prince is not in residence, and an easy way to tell is to look for the flag in the main tower.

The musem of the prince's cars: Located in Fontvielle is the Collection of Voitures Anciennes which is an exhibition featuring some of the private cars in the collection of the Prince of Monaco. There are around 100 cars and models and many of these are vintage vehicles from Europe or America.

The habor: Located at the base of Monaco's famous blustery cliffs is the main harbor of Monaco.Yachts bob on the water and the harbor, which is also known as Port de la Condamine, dates from 1901. The Prince's main yacht is located here as well as those of many moneyed Monaco residents, so this is a top spot to check out these amazing vessels, even if you don't get to go aboard.

The Casino: The Casino de Monte Carlo is one of the most famous casinos in the world, particularly as it was built in the flamboyant Beaux Arts style in 1893. The marble atrium is similarly lavish in style and you will find 28 onyx columns that welcome you to the Gaming Rooms.Fans of James Bond are certain to enjoy the scenery, as this is said to have been the setting for the James Bond novel Casino Royale.

Shopping: Monaco is known for its opulence which also means that you can expect to find a good range of upscale shopping opportunities here. These include perfume, jewellery, and other designer and luxury goods, and one of the best places to splash some cash in Monaco is along the Avenue de Monte-Carlo. If you are looking for famous fashions then you will find these on the swish Boulevard des Moulins. Avenue Princess Grace, named in honor of Grace Kelly, is also another good choice if you want to find some elegant clothes and accessories

They offer amazing meats served with homemade sides of local produce and to be topped with a homemade desert by their pastry Chef.

Day 3

Suggested I Visit Saint Paul de Vence

Saint Paul de Vence Medieval Village is a 35-minute drive from Mougins.

Medieval walls encircle narrow streets and capture the heritage of more than a thousand years. Picking out the marks of history, either alone or with a guide, is to enter into the soul of Saint-Paul de Vence.

The fountain at the heart of the village fills St-Paul's medieval vaults with music. To quote the poet Verlaine: "The fountain's silvery murmur plays on."

From Antiquity to the Castrum Sancti Pauli

Back in Antiquity, an *oppidum* was erected on the Plateau du Puy. In those days, steeper sites were reputed to be safer. Over the centuries, people set up houses around the old church of *Saint Michel du Puy* and the *château* at the top of the hill. Thus evolved the "*castrum*" of Saint-Paul.

In the Middle Ages, Saint-Paul became a border stronghold

In the Middle Ages, the Counts of Provence administered the region and granted several privileges to Saint-Paul. In the 14th century, the village became the county town of a big district. In 1388, the eastern border of Provence was redefined : Saint-Paul occupied a strategic position and became an important border stronghold...

In 1388, the County of Nice switched its allegiance from Provence to the County of Savoy. This modified the eastern border of Provence, henceforth marked by the River Var. Saint-Paul assumed a strategic position in this new political context, becoming a border stronghold of the utmost importance.

Ramparts were erected during the second half of the 14th century. Two of the original towers can still be seen: the Porte de Vence, with machicolations still intact; and the Tour de l'Esperon.

The 19th century brought artists to Saint-Paul

In the 19th century, the hills were covered with flowers, vines and olive trees. As the 20th century dawned, the village's brown stone, the coulours of the countryside and the light of the South of France attracted painters...

Artists first started frequenting Saint-Paul at the beginning of the 1920s. The trail blazers were Paul Signac, Raoul Dufy and Chaïm Soutine. They set up their easels in this peaceful village in Provence, attracted by colours and light of incomparable richness and intensity. Their arrival was fostered by the inauguration of a tramway line between Cagnes-sur-Mer and Vence, via Saint-Paul, in 1911. This opened the village up to the outside world. It was also used to export agricultural produce to Nice, Antibes and Grasse.

The artists enjoyed the company of Paul Roux, a many facetted resident of Saint-Paul – a painter, an art collector and the owner of the Robinson (renamed the Colombe d'Or in 1932), whose walls are still adorned with their paintings even today. Many others followed in their footsteps, including Matisse and Picasso who would call in to see their "neighbours" in Saint-Paul – the former from Vence, the latter from Vallauris and Cannes.

The 20th century: actors, poets and writers

Through the 20th century, actors, artists and writers made Saint-Paul into a bubbling cultural centre. Some simply passed through, others decided to settle. Each in their own way marked the village indelibly. The 1950s and '60s were the village's Golden Age. Saint-Paul became an amazing film set, hosting French and foreign movie stars drawn to the French Riviera by the Victorine film studios in Nice and by the Cannes Film Festival.

Jacques Prévert lived in Saint-Paul for about fifteen years, occupying a tiny house right in the centre of the village called La Miette. He acted as a magnet on other film directors such as Henri-Georges Clouzot and André Cayatte. James Baldwin and Marc Chagall lived in the village for almost 20 years, but opted for the peace and quiet of the surrounding countryside. For over a century now, Saint-Paul de Vence has been forging its identity as a hub of the arts and culture. Its reputation now extends well beyond the frontiers of the French Riviera, boosted by the famous Maeght Foundation inaugurated in 1964, and the chapel decorated by Jean-Michel Folon, which opened in 2008.





Suggested I Lunch at the Restaurant La Colomb d'Or I Saint Paul de Vence

La Colombe d'Or represents a unique aspect of the French "art de vivre" (art of living). It's not just a place to dine; it's an immersive experience that celebrates the blending of art, culture, and gastronomy in a way that feels authentic and timeless.

Today, La Colombe d'Or is almost like an open-air museum. Dining here means being surrounded by world-class art, including paintings, ceramics, and sculptures. The restaurant's terrace, which offers views of the surrounding Provencal landscape, features large works from these artists, making the setting unique and intimate. The art collection gives it a cultural prestige few restaurants can match.

Suggested I Private tour of La Maison Godet I Saint Paul de Vence

Maison Godet in St Paul de Vence was founded in 1901, today Sonia Godet is the 4th generation to carry on the family knowhow of perfumery. Sonia, is a passionate fragrance maker and the 4th generation of the perfume branch of the family, which originated from a family heritage of Cognac producers during 15 generations over 400 years.

Today, in the footsteps of her ancestors, Sonia is dedicated to making perfume a real work of art as she accomplishes this in absolute detail following the inherited expertise for the entire process from the maceration to the distillation of the flowers, the composition of perfumes which she explains with vibrant enthusiasm. Each detail from the perfume bottles which are hand blown and shaped by a master glassmaker to the packaging which is all handmade.





Suggested I Dinner at the Restaurant Le Figuier Saint Esprit I Antibes

The gourmet restaurant Le Figuier de Saint Esprit located in Antibes bears witness to a history, that of creative cuisine, initiated by Christian Morisset, whose sources are based on a solid tradition and immense experience.

Proof of this authentic and creative cuisine , this restaurant located on the ramparts of Old Antibes is recognized with 1 star in the Michelin Guide .

The quality and taste of his cuisine are based first of all on the choice of his products, coming from a daily market. Christian Morisset pays particular, meticulous, even draconian attention to quality, taste and freshness.

Delicate and without excess, his cuisine subtly combines flavors and colors: no unnecessary flourishes, just harmony, refinement, finesse so that the scents of the earth and the flavors of the sea marry with precision and intoxicate all your senses. Follow this master who will lead you to share intense, prodigious, and unforgettable moments. His dishes will mark your culinary memory and will provoke with the wines an alchemy, a symbiosis of all your senses.
